On behalf of the Louisiana Organ Procurement Agency, I would like to extend to you and your family my deepest condolences upon the death of your husband, Jeremy McGraner. Although very little can be said to comfort you during this difficult time, may you find solace in the knowledge that your unselfish act of donation has brought about a miracle.

We were able to recover Jeremy's liver, kidneys, heart, pancreas and eyes. I would like to share the outcome of this donation with you.

Jeremy's liver was transplanted into a 64-year-old gentleman from Florida. He is married with three children and had been on the transplant waiting list for one month. He is currently doing well in the hospital.

Jeremy's right kidney was transplanted into a 43-year-old married lady from Georgia. She had been on the waiting list for three months and is currently recovering well.

Jeremy's left kidney was transplanted into a 13-year-old young man from Pennsylvania. He is a student and had been on the waiting list with kidney disease for 13 months. This gentleman is recovering well.

Jeremy's pancreas was transplanted into a 50-year-old gentleman from Pennsylvania who had been on the waiting list for 21 months. His previous diagnosis was diabetes. He is now recovering well at home.

Jeremy's heart was transplanted into a 36-year-old gentleman from Alabama. He is married and has six children. This gentleman is recovering well.

In addition, we were able to recover Jeremy's eyes for transplant. Through your generous consent, two more people will have the opportunity to see. Such transplants can allow them to return to normal, active and fulfilling lives.

It is my sincerest hope that you and your family find comfort in knowing that you and Jeremy have saved and improved the quality of life for these people and their families. I thank you on behalf of the recipients and for the thousands of people still waiting. Thank you for allowing me to be a part of the miracle you and Jeremy made possible. I wish you and your family strength in the days ahead.
